New Life Bible Study Topics

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Aim

The *New Life Bible Study* is designed to introduce people to the true message of Salvation. We aim to lead people to make the decision to give their lives to Jesus through dying to self. This series of meetings will lead them to a closer walk with Jesus as a friend, and eventually motivate them to start being active for the mission of God, by leading their own Bible Studies. Through this Bible Study people will develop a relationship with God and also join in winning souls for Jesus. This way, the spreading of the gospel will have a multiplication effect.

Bible Study

Each Bible study leader will be given the *New Life Bible Study* packet. This will include a series of 10 Bible studies. They will be in an outline discussion format, giving you room to be yourself and give your own comments. The questions are open-ended. Therefore, there will be a variety of answers. It is important to have each member in the group be involved and interact. This small group provides a support family for the group members, who are trying to get closer to Jesus.

Three Goals

In every Bible study your goal is to get the people to:

Understand

Make sure they understand the message that you are trying to give. If they don't understand, then it would be harder for you to reach the next two goals.

Accept

Have them accept the message as something that is important for their lives.

Apply

This is the most important. Lead them to a decision to apply the message to their lives.

Important Reminders

Topic 1) On the first topic, "***Dying to Self and Sin***" lead them to that commitment of surrender – that born again experience. Have a prayer of surrender with them at the end of your study, and then have each one of them have their own prayer of surrender in their own heart for about 3 minutes. Also, stress the importance of making that prayer of surrender everyday – to die daily.

Topic 2) On the second topic, "***Spending time with Jesus***" pass out the *Reading Through Mark* packet. You want them to try to read the Bible every day. By each one reading the passages for that week, at the next and following meetings, the group can discuss what was read. This is very important, because without spending time with God and dying daily, their relationship with Jesus will hardly come off the ground. Also, this provides a sense of unity for the group.

Topic 6) The topic, "***Being an Example***" will start the motivation to be active in God's work.

Topic 8) The topic, "***The Burial***" is an important message. Appeal for baptism and rebaptism. Don't force a decision on them, but remind them, every once in a while (especially the following week) about the possibility of making this decision. You might also want to remind them on the last day somehow, but let it be between them and God. God will convict. I have seen Him do it.

Topic 10) On the last topic, "***Being Partners with God***" you want witnessing to come across as having the awesome privilege to be partners with God. On this day give them their *New Life Bible Study* packet, and tell them that next semester after some training and practice they will be partnered with another person in the group to give Bible studies.

This schedule can be subject to change, depending on your group.

Meeting Schedule

- (10 minutes) Waiting for people to come
 -You can start the icebreaker question at this time, if necessary.
- (1 minute) Prayer
- (5-10 minutes) Checking Up / Optional Icebreaker Question
 -See how the week went for each member. Enquire of how their spiritual life is going. Give advice and encouragement when needed.
 -On the 2nd week and onward ask to find out whether they have been dying daily.
 -On the 3rd week and onward ask to find out whether they have been spending time with God, and discuss the section that has been read.
- (5-10 minutes) Prayer Request and Thanksgiving
- (25-30 minutes) Bible Study
- (2-5 minutes) Closing Prayer

*Nothing is carved in stone. Adjust when necessary to suit your group of people.
Try to end 5 minutes before your time is up.
Start no later than 10 minutes after starting time.*

The Lock that Houdini Couldn't Break

Harry Houdini, the famed escape artist issued a challenge wherever he went. He could be locked in any jail cell in the country, he claimed, and set himself free quickly and easily. He had freed himself from dozens of cells until one time something went wrong. He entered the jail in his street clothes, as he always did. The heavy, metal doors clanged shut behind him. He took from his belt a concealed piece of metal, strong and flexible. He set to work immediately, but something seemed to be unusual about this lock. Thirty minutes passed with no result, then an hour. After two hours, he was bathed in sweat and panting in exasperation, but he still could not pick the lock. Exhausted, he collapsed against the door—and it swung open! It was never locked in the first place. But in Houdini's mind it was locked, and that was all it took to keep him from opening the door and walking out.

***God has given us freedom from sin when we give our lives to Him (die to self),
but many times we are still trapped, because we believe we're trapped.***

Let us grab hold of the freedom that Jesus has given us.

Introduction

Read It

1 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God; 2 As it is written in the prophets, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee. 3 The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. 4 John did baptize in the wilderness, and preach the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. 5 And there went out unto him all the land of Judaea, and they of Jerusalem, and were all baptized of him in the river of Jordan, confessing their sins. 6 And John was clothed with camel's hair, and with a girdle of a skin about his loins; and he did eat locusts and wild honey; 7 And preached, saying, There cometh one mightier than I after me, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to stoop down and unloose. 8 I indeed have baptized you with water: but he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost. 9 And it came to pass in those days, that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized of John in Jordan. 10 And straightway coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit like a dove descending upon him: 11 And there came a voice from heaven, saying, Thou art my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.

We see here two things. John is presenting the gospel, and Jesus appears on the scene to save us. As we read through the book of Mark we are going to see the gospel presented to us. Receive it, and let Jesus come into your heart to save you.

Read It

12 And immediately the Spirit driveth him into the wilderness. 13 And he was there in the wilderness forty days, tempted of Satan; and was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered unto him.

14 Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, 15 And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel. 16 Now as he walked by the sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. 17 And Jesus said unto them, Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men. 18 And straightway they forsook their nets, and followed him. 19 And when he had gone a little further thence, he saw James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, who also were in the ship mending their nets. 20 And straightway he called them: and they left their father Zebedee in the ship with the hired servants, and went after him.

Read It

21 And they went into Capernaum; and straightway on the sabbath day he entered into the synagogue, and taught. 22 And they were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes.

23 And there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, 24 Saying, Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God. 25 And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him. 26 And when the unclean spirit had torn him, and cried with a loud voice, he came out of him. 27 And they were all amazed, insomuch that they questioned among themselves, saying, What thing is this? what new doctrine is this? for with authority commandeth he even the unclean spirits, and they do obey him. 28 And immediately his fame spread abroad throughout all the region round about Galilee.

29 And forthwith, when they were come out of the synagogue, they entered into the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. 30 But Simon's wife's mother lay sick of a fever, and anon they tell him of her. 31 And he came and took her by the hand, and lifted her up; and immediately the fever left her, and she ministered unto them.

The power of Jesus' miracles is evident in this passage. He is able to heal the sick and deliver someone from a demon.

Read It

32 And at even, when the sun did set, they brought unto him all that were diseased, and them that were possessed with devils. 33 And all the city was gathered together at the door. 34 And he healed many that were sick of divers diseases, and cast out many devils; and suffered not the devils to speak, because they knew him. 35 And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed. 36 And Simon and they that were with him followed after him. 37 And when they had found him, they said unto him, All men seek for thee. 38 And he said unto them, Let us go into the next towns, that I may preach there also: for therefore came I forth. 39 And he preached in their synagogues throughout all Galilee, and cast out devils. 40 And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him, If thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. 41 And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean. 42 And as soon as he had spoken, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed. 43 And he straightly charged him, and forthwith sent him away; 44 And saith unto him, See thou say nothing to any man: but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer for thy cleansing those things which Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them. 45 But he went out, and began to publish it much, and to blaze abroad the matter, insomuch that Jesus could no more openly enter into the city, but was without in desert places: and they came to him from every quarter.

Read It

1 And again he entered into Capernaum after some days; and it was noised that he was in the house. 2 And straightway many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive them, no, not so much as about the door: and he preached the word unto them. 3 And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four. 4 And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken it up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay. 5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee. 6 But there were certain of the scribes sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts, 7 Why doth this man thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only? 8 And immediately when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, Why reason ye these things in your hearts? 9 Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk? 10 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,) 11 I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy bed, and go thy way into thine house. 12 And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion.

Read It

13 And he went forth again by the sea side; and all the multitude resorted unto him, and he taught them. 14 And as he passed by, he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the receipt of custom, and said unto him, Follow me. And he arose and followed him. 15 And it came to pass, that, as Jesus sat at meat in his house, many publicans and sinners sat also together with Jesus and his disciples: for there were many, and they followed him. 16 And when the scribes and Pharisees saw him eat with publicans and sinners, they said unto his disciples, How is it that he eateth and drinketh with publicans and sinners? 17 When Jesus heard it, he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of the physician, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

Levi, otherwise known as Matthew, was part of a group whom the Jews rejected, but yet Jesus calls him to follow Him. You might feel rejected or no good, but Jesus still wants you, and He's calling you to follow Him.

~Mark 2:18-22~

Read It

18 And the disciples of John and of the Pharisees used to fast: and they come and say unto him, Why do the disciples of John and of the Pharisees fast, but thy disciples fast not? 19 And Jesus said unto them, Can the children of the bridechamber fast, while the bridegroom is with them? as long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. 20 But the days will come, when the bridegroom shall be taken away from them, and then shall they fast in those days. 21 No man also seweth a piece of new cloth on an old garment: else the new piece that filled it up taketh away from the old, and the rent is made worse. 22 And no man putteth new wine into old bottles: else the new wine doth burst the bottles, and the wine is spilled, and the bottles will be marred: but new wine must be put into new bottles.

We shouldn't use a new cloth to patch up old clothes. Neither should we put what's new in a old bottle. It must be new. This metaphor is letting us know that new and old can't be mixed in the spiritual life. If you want a new life, you're going to have to leave the old things behind.
